

MINUTES OF THE MEETING
ALTON HISTORICAL COMMISSION SUB-COMMITTEE
Wednesday, March 17, 2016, at 2:00 p.m.

The meeting of the Sub-Committee of Alton Historical Commission was called to order by Deputy Chairwoman Mary Anderson on Wednesday, March 17, 2016, at 2:00 p.m.

APPLICATIONS:

Marilyn Tohill and her contractor Bob Hardy presented an application for **313-315 E 3rd St.** Tohill and Hardy stated that they are going to replace the rod iron railing and post on the front porches with white vinyl spindles and white vinyl posts. The wooden galley rail will be replaced with a white vinyl galley rail. Hardy stated that the gables on the top of the building have rusted. Hardy stated he would treat the rusted section with an inhibitor and replace with white shake style vinyl. He stated all of the original wood work and decorative wood pieces would stay. The back decks were all going to be replaced with gorilla decking with white spindle rails. Tohill stated one unit has had the windows replaced with vinyl windows. She stated that she will be replacing the remaining windows in the same style as previously stated, vinyl, no grids. The size of the windows will remain the same. Hardy stated that all windows will then be capped in the same style.

Matt Asselmeier made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mary Anderson seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Sharley Hindelang then took the floor to present the application for **421 Belleview.** Hindelang stated that her contractor was unable to attend due to illness, so she would answer the questions to the best of her ability. She stated that there are five windows in need of replacement. She provided brochure for the windows replacement windows. These windows will be double hung with both glasses being equal in size and will not have grid lines. The size of the windows will remain the same. The windows are being ordered through RP Lumber with Frank Bornes being the contractor. She stated that other windows will be replaced as necessary at a later date.

Matt Asselmeier made a motion to accept the proposal as presented. Mary Anderson seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

There being no further discussion, or comments from the public, the meeting was adjourned at 2:12 p.m.
