

ADA Committee

A meeting of the ADA Committee was called to order at 10:05 A.M., on July 15, 2015, at Alton City Hall, 101 E. Third Street, Alton, Illinois.

Members Present: Tammy Kaus, Amanda Scoggins, Sue Wuellner-Derr, Margaret Renken, Michael Haynes, Mary Boulds, Wendy Settles, and Chairman Matt Asselmeier

Members Absent: Chief Jason Simmons, Mike Parsons, Mike Harvey, Jarvis Swope, and Dan Herkert

Introductions occurred.

Sue Wuellner-Derr made a motion to approve the minutes of the August 27, 2014, meeting, seconded by Margaret Renken. Motion passed unanimously.

The Committee reviewed the recommendations for 2014-2015 and 2016-2019.

Margaret Renken is going to check with Fire Chief Bernie Sebold on the status of the recommendations related to the Fire Department. The recommendations drafted after evaluating both Fire Stations shall be postponed another year, unless a complaint has been filed with the City.

Matt Asselmeier will check with Bobby Barnhart regarding recommendations related to Public Works and the following items: remedying the defects found at the Sewer Treatment Plant, the Club House at Spencer T, at Dormann Square, at the parking lots at Rock Spring Park, and defects regarding MCT bus stations.

All website and information technology recommendations will be transferred from the ADA Coordinator to the IT Director.

The recommendations related to the Foresters Shed and Heartland Prairie will be moved to 2016 for completion.

The recommendation regarding the bronze sculpture at Diamond 5 Hopkins will be moved to 2018. Also at Gordon Moore Park, dugouts at 4 of the ball fields have been brought into compliance and the water fountain at Diamond 5 Hopkins is not functioning. All of the defects at Muenstermann, the Oriental Garden, and the bath house have been resolved. Matt Asselmeier will contact Mary Campbell regarding defects at the garage. The remaining recommendations for Gordon Moore Park will be implemented by 2019.

The ownership issue at the tennis courts at Rock Spring has been resolved and the issues related to the ball fields have been resolved. Matt Asselmeier will check with the manager of the golf course regarding defects at that location. The remaining defects at Rock Spring will be remedied by 2018.

The accessibility issues at James H. Killion Park at Salu are mostly resolved.

The recommendation regarding employee training will be moved to 2016 for completion. The recommendation regarding evaluation of job descriptions, job applications and personnel policies is complete.

All of the recommendations related to the Alton Marina have been completed; however, the City is still waiting on an official list of defects from the Department of Natural Resources.

Matt Asselmeier will contact Brett Stawar for an update on defects at the CVB.

Matt Asselmeier will check with Police Chief Jason Simmons regarding the Police Department Training Building.

There were no recommendations for consideration for the year 2020.

Matt Asselmeier reported that after all unresolved issues have been addressed, another Committee meeting will occur to review the proposal and to schedule the necessary public meetings.

There were no comments from the public or other business from Committee members.

Sue Wuellner-Derr made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Margaret Renken. Motion passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 10:40 A.M.
